

Wild Scotland Membership Breach of Code of Conduct

A complaint that a Wild Scotland Member has breached the Wild Scotland **Code of Conduct should be made** by emailing: info@wild-scotland.co.uk . The email should provide details of the alleged breach.

The following steps will then be taken:

- The member in question will be contacted, the details of the alleged breach will be provided and the member will be given the opportunity to respond in writing.
- Three Wild Scotland Directors will be appointed to investigate the complaint in alignment with the **Code of Conduct** and the Wild Scotland **Terms of Reference**.
- If the member is found to be in breach of the **Code of Conduct**, they may be sent a written warning and given the opportunity to make amends or they may be expelled from membership, subject to the procedures outlined below:
 - A member is entitled to appeal a decision to issue a written warning or to be expelled by making a written submission by email to the Chair, within 21 days of the date of the decision being appealed against. The decision of the Chair shall be final.
 - Any person may be expelled from membership by special resolution providing the following procedures have been observed:
 - At least 21 days' notice of the intention to propose the resolution must be given to the member concerned specifying the grounds for proposed expulsion.
 - The member concerned shall be entitled to be heard on the **resolution** at the general meeting at which the resolution is proposed.

 A person who ceases to be a member (for any reason) will not be entitled to any refund of the membership subscription.
